Below is a timeline of projects that will be funded through the ALL TOGETHER campaign, listed by the estimated year of completion. From new visitor experiences to reimagining our museum grounds, to building a new creative arts space on the North Shore, there are plenty of opportunities to support the growth of Pittsburgh's most essential cultural institution.

## Mars: The Next Giant Leap

This experience at Kamin Science Center transports visitors to a settlement on the red planet, providing a glimpse into how future residents might live and the challenges they'd face in that waterless and inhospitable world.



## Reimagined Permanent Galleries

The ongoing reimagining of Carnegie Museum of Art's Scaife Galleries leverages new art histories and points of engagement, repositioning the collection as an even more relevant 21st-century resource.



## Sports 360

The largest-ever exhibition to open inside Kamin Science Center builds on the passion for sports ingrained in Pittsburgh's psyche with interactive experiences that explain the science behind some of your favorite sports.



## Heinz Architectural Center Refresh

A redesign of Carnegie Museum of Art's Heinz Architectural Center will refresh the visitor experience with exciting contemporary experiences and events.



## Egypt on the Nile

Carnegie Museum of Natural History will unveil its much-anticipated immersive exhibition that explores the interdependence of natural and human history through ancient Egypt's relationship with the Nile.

## The Factory: Creative Arts Center

The flagship campus development of The Andy Warhol Museum's Pop District initiative, a new creative arts center will open across General Robinson Street to host interdisciplinary performing arts and exhibitions.

## Rotating Exhibition Space

Located in the former Walton Hall of Egypt, this gallery on Carnegie Museum of Natural History's third floor will unite art and science, attracting new and diverse audiences.



## Natural Wonder

A multisensory exhibition at Carnegie Museum of Natural History for early learners and their adults will foster curiosity and exploration around the natural world.

## The Pop District

The Andy Warhol Museum's \$60 million initiative to transform a five-block area on Pittsburgh's North Shore included the creation of Pop Park, a new silkscreening Print Lounge, and a workforce development program offering a diploma in digital marketing and paid fellowships. Still to come is The Factory: Creative Arts Center.



## Carnegie Music Hall Renovation

Carnegie Music Hall's largest renovation since it opened in 1895 preserved the historic beauty of the hall while introducing critical updates such as new wiring, modern air-conditioning, and improved accessibility.

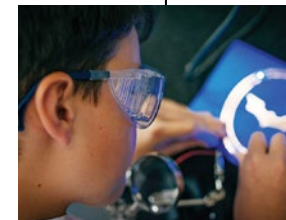
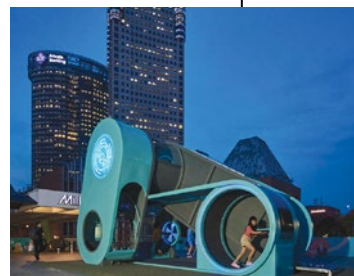


## The Science of Speed

The all-new exhibition at Kamin Science Center will feature interactive activities designed to inform and inspire young visitors, transforming how they view career opportunities in the trades.



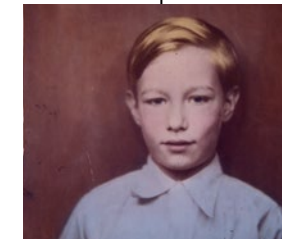
## Photovoltaic Canopy
